Vernon Forklift License - Obtaining a forklift certification or forklift license in North America will require the one training to carry out hands-on training in addition to classroom instruction. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the certification, training and licensing for powered industrial truck operators. Operators may obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machine that is designed together with different alternatives, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and a wide variety of types and sizes to meet the industrial requirements of workers. Operator training courses are usually individualized to be able address the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift within a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and equipment. Regulatory standards, therefore, tend not to concentrate on specific course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to be given their forklift license or certification. This particular method of certification needs the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on equipment within the workplace. Employers may opt to train staff on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The course incorporates forklift operation methods, forklift maintenance, safety measures and company policies. Subject matters specific to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize each kind of forklift on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process will typically consist of an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a forklift for that specific employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential aspect of the forklift license training, though the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the machinery being used. Several safety issues would vary for every industry and employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for instance in marine and offshore operations.
