Vernon Boom Lift Operator Training - A cherry picker refers to a kind of aerial work platform. Cherry pickers consist of a bucket or platform at the end of a hydraulic lifting system. The device is likewise referred to as a boom lift, man lift, hydraladder or basket crane.

The bucket of platform is sometimes mounted to or set unto a truck or other vehicle and is occasionally known as a bucket truck. Other vehicles that can be used are stand-alone trailers, self-moving platform or flat back pickup vans. The one working stands within the bucket and works from there. The person within the bucket usually comprises an upper set of controls enabling manipulation of the bucket's position. The bucket's reach can be extended on several models by telescoping to adjust the lifting arm. Safety controls which are automatic prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are suggested when it is necessary to clear obstacles or for working in tight areas.

Cherry pickers, as the name implies, were originally constructed for picking fruit at high levels in trees. These machines are usually used in different businesses such as exterior painting, construction and mining. Sometimes they are used for cleaning windows on high building. The machines are used to service cable television, electrical equipment and telephone on utility poles. Sometimes, firefighters use cherry pickers, referred to as snorkels, when ladders are insufficient. At Christmas season, civic workers can be seen inside cherry pickers hanging banners and lights.
